

North Clay High School National Honor Society Selection Process

Selection into the National Honor Society is based on the student's achievements in scholarship, service, leadership, and character. Membership into the National Honor Society is one of the highest honors granted to high school students.

1. Membership is open to juniors and seniors that have a cumulative grade point average of 94 % or higher after the first semester of their junior or senior year.
2. Each qualifying student receives a candidate form that includes leadership roles; service activities; other student activities; other community activities; and work experience, recognition, and awards. These forms need to be turned in to the advisor on time and complete.
3. The faculty members are given a list of the students that qualify and they evaluate the candidates on their character. The criteria set by the National Honor Society include: morality, ethics, trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, caring, and citizenship.
4. A five member faculty council reviews the candidate forms, the faculty evaluations, and any other verifiable information relevant to the student's candidacy. Once the Faculty Council has made their decisions the candidates will be notified of their selection or non-selection into the National Honor Society.

Selected members will need to attend and participate in a formal induction ceremony. In order to continue to be a member of the National Honor Society, students must maintain the criteria for admission (scholarship, service, leadership, and character).
